



Membership of the Polish Society for Psychodynamic Psychotherapy

Criteria for membership of PSPP are determined by the Statute (chapter III).

Ordinary membership (Article 12)

1. Full membership is open to natural persons having full legal capacity, citizens of Poland or foreigners enjoying full public rights, who meet all of the following conditions:
 - a. have obtained the title of magister (master, MA) or lekarz medycyny (medical doctor, M.D.) – or an equivalent title in the case of foreigners,
 - b. have achieved a certificate of training in psychodynamic psychotherapy based on a curriculum approved by the Council of the Society,
 - c. have worked as a psychodynamic psychotherapist for at least 3 years,
 - d. have accepted the statutory goals of the Society,
 - e. have submitted a written application for full membership of the Society,
 - f. have received a written recommendation from two full members of the Society.
2. A decision to grant full membership is taken by the Executive Board in the form of a resolution.

Extraordinary membership (Article 13)

1. Associate membership is open to natural persons having full legal capacity, citizens of Poland or foreigners enjoying full public rights, who meet all of the following conditions:
 - a. have obtained the title of magister (master, MA) or lekarz medycyny (medical doctor, M.D.) – or an equivalent title in the case of foreigners,
 - b. are pursuing training in psychodynamic psychotherapy based on a curriculum approved by the Council of the Society or have completed such training without a certificate,
 - c. have worked as a psychodynamic psychotherapist for less than 3 years,
 - d. have accepted the statutory goals of the Society,
 - e. have submitted a written application for associate membership of the Society,
 - f. have received a written recommendation from two full members of the Society.
2. A decision to grant associate membership is taken by the Executive Board in the form of a resolution.
